

Ongoing projects Medialab, ACTV & Libraries.am.




Every year, Medialab unites young artists and art amateurs to experience contemporary art practices that are not available in any other art institution or platform in Armenia.

Medialab is unique, as it is the only educational initiative delivering free art education and "producing" artists, ensuring their direct connection with and engagement in local (contemporary) art environments, providing various tools and facilities for implementation of their projects, as well as helping them to specialize and work in Armenia's contemporary art institutions.

In 2007, Medialab was launched as an experimental educational program with only a few courses and workshops. Currently, it is a semi-annual program which consists of 10 separate courses on Contemporary Art, Photography, Graphic Design, Creative Writing, Sound Art, Editing, etc., conducted by leading professionals of the respective fields.

Throughout these 10 years, number of similar educational initiatives and intitutions have died down or dissapeared at all, not being able to overcome financial or political crisises. Unlike them, Medialab not only managed to overcome these crisises, but it has also managed to keep the project developing and expanding constantly, thus, becoming the most popular program among young arists and amateurs.






